Funeral Honors Program. www.wisvets.com/funeralhor - 1-800-947-8387.

The military honors program assists families and funeral directors by providing and coordinating funeral honors for Veterans. Based on available resources honors can include the presence of Military Members, folding and presentation of the flag, firing details, and the sounding of Taps.

For more information, contact the MFHP toll-free at 1-877-944-6667.

A standard military honors ceremony consists of the firing of three rifle volleys, the sound of "Taps", the folding of the flag, and the presentation of the flag to the next of kin. Each veteran is entitled, by law and upon request, to at least two uniformed service personnel who will provide the basic honors. Due to availability of personnel, a rifle detail is not always possible and, if available, is normally provided by a Veterans Service Organization. When arranging for military funeral honors, if the family desires military participation, they need to ensure their desires are expressed to their funeral director, who in turn will contact their MFHP for coordination of the honors. If no funeral director is involved, families may call the MFHP directly for assistance.

The MFHP provides funeral honors training, ammunition and other honors assistance to Veterans Service Organizations (VSOs) upon request. The training includes both flag folding and rifle training.



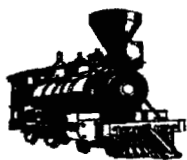

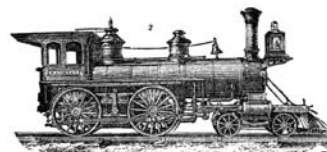

Many of you may know about or have used the La Crosse Veterans Service Office. It is a great resource and advocate for La Crosse County Veterans. The following is the La Crosse Veterans Service Office Mission Statement and Vision Statement.

Our Mission

The mission of the Veterans Service Office is to assist and support La Crosse County veterans and their family members in recognition of the sacrifices and Service of veterans to La Crosse County, the state of Wisconsin, and the United States.

Our Vision

Ensure respect for Veterans achievements and sacrifices on behalf of the nation and the world.

Demonstrate leadership and advice for La Crosse County Veterans.

Intensify our commitment to service excellence while assisting Veterans with the applications for state and federal Veterans programs.

The La Crosse Veterans Service Office can help you with your federal benefits, state benefits or county benefits. These federal benefits include such things as disability benefits, medical care, home loans, education and training, survivor benefits, life insurance, homeless veterans or alcohol and drug rehabilitation. The state benefits cover home, personal and home improvement loans, grants, veteran's homes and veteran assistance centers. County Benefits cover recording of DD214s, obtaining certified copies of vital records, and Veteran Service Commission help.

The La Crosse County Veterans' Service Office is located in the County Administrative Center, 400 4th Street North, La Crosse, Wisconsin. Office hours are from 8:30 AM to 5:00 PM Monday through Friday. Telephone number is (608) 785-9719. The Veterans Service Officer is James Gausmann with Sue Otten the Veterans Services Specialist.

Give them a call. It is a great one-stop benefit service to all veterans and their dependents.
