Veterans Outreach

A new position has been created for Post 336 called "Veterans Outreach Liaison". The goal of the position is to outreach to Post 336 veterans on the available federal and state benefits. The position is not to help them get the benefits, but rather, it is to make them aware of what is available, and help them get in contact with the proper authorities and departments to obtain additional information and help. If a veteran is having a problem getting answers, or help, then the Veterans Outreach Liaison becomes its advocate and helps them get the answers they need. How can that be done?

First of all if anyone needs to contact me on one of the benefits, questions, etc. you can contact me at (608) 790-7368.

Second, I will start by being at Post 336 at least 1/2 day per month. But I would first like your input as to the what days; What about doing it on a Saturday afternoon?

Third, I will be putting some presentations together on benefits that can be given at the monthly meetings. They shouldn't take more than 15 minutes. I think I can also get some people in to speak on these programs was well.

Finally, we are also looking into the potential for doing an outreach to the vets at UW-L, WTC, and Viterbo. That can be done, but I need to wait until late September to do that. By then school will be back in place and I can make some contacts then.

Let me introduce myself! My name is Thom Downer, I grew up in Bangor. My mother and father were officers in the army during WWII. I was in the Air Force during the Vietnam War. 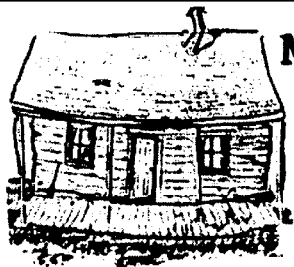

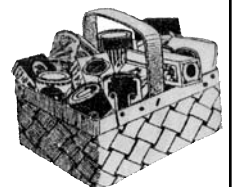
